## **Beach Operations Vehicle Policy**

### Introduction

The purpose of this policy is to provide an overview of the management, use and terms required for the Coogee Beach Surf Life Saving Club's (the Club) Beach Operations Vehicles. This policy covers the operation of all vehicles: ATVs, Tractors and Club 4x4s. This document should be read in conjunction with the following documents

# Act Responsibly and Safely

The operator of any Club vehicle has a responsibility to the crew, the community and the Club to act in a responsible and considerate manner before, during and after the operation of the vehicle.

i. The pre-approval of permitted use does not guarantee the availability of a vehicle; refer to "Booking Protocol" in this document.

iii. Any off-site activity not listed on the Permitted Activity list above must be approved in writing by the Vice President Beach Operations.

# **Booking Protocol**

Use of a Club vehicle for on road (i.e. offsite) use must be booked via the Vehicle Usage Calendar on Office 365 (via the respective Director and the Club Administrator, e-mail: <a href="mailto:clubadministrator@cbslsc.com.au">clubadministrator@cbslsc.com.au</a>) with reasonable prior notice. In the event of conflicting bookings, the Club Captain will determine the priority of use.

## **Authorised Drivers**

Personnel must meet the following pre-requisites for authorisation to drive vehicles:

- Hold a valid license permitting the holder to drive a C class vehicle in WA;
- Be a current member of CBSLSC;
- Participate in and acknowledge understanding of a driver induction for the relevant vehicle:
- Complete the driver declaration and acceptance process; and
- Be authorised to drive the vehicle (name on authorised drivers list located in the driver's door).

Personnel using vehicles for lifesaving duties are also required to hold a current proficiency in the SLSA Bronze Medallion.

It is desirable for Lifesavers to also:

- Hold a current proficient Senior First Aid Certificate;
- Hold a current proficient Advanced Resuscitation Certificate; and
- Have completed a four-wheel drive induction<sup>3</sup> (appropriate to vehicle)

# **Vehicle Operation**

All authorised drivers are required to observe the Club's vehicle operating procedures per CB036 - Beach Operations Vehicle Standard Operating Procedures.
